NATIONAL RESPECT LIFE MONTH: Building a Culture of Life.

The U.S. bishops last month urged Congress to reauthorize legislation to combat human trafficking. Calling it a "horrific crime against the basic human dignity and rights of the human person," Bishop Gerald R. Barnes, speaking on behalf of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, urged Congress to reauthorize the Trafficking Victims Protection Act (TVPA), which is set to expire this month. "This legislation should be reauthorized, adequately funded, and aggressively implemented," said Bishop Barnes.

The statement paid particular attention to the exploitation of children by human traffickers and called for additional efforts to protect and care for child trafficking victims. Barnes urged the federal government to place emphasis on the recovery and care of victims, particularly "child trafficking victims, who are most susceptible to the long-term horrors of this crime." Bishop Barnes also stated that the Catholic Church can play an instrumental role in educating Catholics and others about this crime and that Catholics can help in that effort. "In the end, we must work together - church, state, and community - to eliminate the root causes and markets that permit traffickers to flourish; to make whole the survivors of this crime; and to ensure that one day soon trafficking in human persons vanishes from the face of the earth."
