From the desk of Fr. Tom Jackson, Pastor
“The other disciple also went in... he saw and believed.”

Christ is Risen! Alleluia! Happy Easter!

Forty days ago we began our Lenten journey together. Most of us discerned there were areas in our lives which needed to be reformed, to be touched by God in a special way, so that the deeper meanings of life could be appreciated. We decided to lift these areas up in prayer, confident that God would give us insight as to how to best deal with it and to live life in the fullest.

After a long period of sacrificial cleansing we are now at the great day of celebration, Easter. The season of sacrifice has ended and the festal season of Joy is upon us. The question is, “did the prayed-for change in our lives occur... or, are we still wondering in the wilderness?” As I contemplated this question, today’s gospel presented itself in a new way.

In the gospel, Saint Mary Magdalene (*Patroness of the Order of Preachers since 1297*) tells the Apostles that the body of the Lord was missing. Saints Peter and John set off in haste for the tomb. John, being younger, beats Peter to the tomb, he looks in and sees the burial cloths—but goes no farther. Peter then arrives and, with his usual impetuosity, boldly enters the tomb. Then John also goes in. He looks at the cloths and believes. But, what is it that John came to believe?

John, often referred to as the Beloved Disciple, has been a faithful follower of Jesus for several years. His love of and faith in Jesus placed him, with the Blessed Mother, at the foot of the cross when all other disciples were in hiding. These things speak of a closeness to and confidence in Jesus which assumes that John has been a “believer” for some time now. So, what is it that he comes to believe at the tomb early that Resurrection Morning? It may be a matter of “seeing, but not seeing”; visually seeing a thing, but not understanding its meaning.

Scholar William Barclay points out that both disciples were shocked that the tomb was empty. They probably speculated as to what had happened to the Master’s body, maybe assuming that enemies had taken it. But what occurs to John is that *if* the body had been taken, why were the burial cloths left behind? Furthermore, why were the cloths lying there *still in their folds*? Barclay notes that the point of the description given is to relate that “the grave clothes did not look as if they had been put off or taken off; they were lying there in their regular folds *as if the body of Jesus had simply evaporated out of them*”! This insight penetrated John’s mind; he realized what had happened—and he believed in the resurrection.

In our lives we experience moments when we “see, but do not see”. Like St. Peter, we witness many things in life—and could very well describe them in detail—but, our minds do not penetrate to the deeper *meaning* of the thing witnessed.

With Easter comes the newness of life that is Spring.

The Joy of Easter comes with not only seeing the newness of life, but also believing that the newness has a deeper meaning. The Beloved Disciple relates in the gospel, Jesus “came that we may have life and have it in the fullest” (John 10:10). The essence of the Pascal Feast is that we have—by the life, death *and* resurrection of Christ Jesus—been given new eyes to see, new ears to hear and new hearts to love... all more abundantly. In what ways does Easter bring a greater appreciation for all that is around us... how are we celebrating and living “life in the fullest”?
