Growing up I knew and respected a priest named
Father Mukluk. His most common response to a question
with an obvious answer was *“Does a catholic know guilt?”*
In the past as ACA Coordinator, I think I’ve taken that joke
a little too literally. I have used guilt as a reason people
should give. In doing so I not only missed the point myself I
was unfair to all of you. If guilt is the only reason you ever
give to charity you are missing the joy of charity. You are
missing the chance to build relationships with your
community and with God. You are missing the Joy of
spreading God’s Love!

I learned this again during Easter watching the
children work on the Kid’s food drive for the Good
Sheppard House. The church doubled the kid’s goal of 400
items in 40 days. (THANK YOU For Your Generosity!)
The food drive was such a success it required a couple
afternoons of the kids sorting and packing food to get it to
the Good Sheppard house. I expected that getting a bunch
of six and seven year olds to give up their weekend to do
work was going to be like taking away TV. They surprised
me not only by how “willingly” they did it, but also by how
they relished the joy of the effort. They had more fun than I
can possibly express!!!!

In a homily from last month, I think Fr. Tom
captured the essence of charity by defining God’s nature. In
that homily he said *“God by Nature Puts Relationship and
Community First.”* Giving, builds relationships by putting
our faith to work and spreading God’s joy. The joy you get
from giving and the joy experienced by someone receiving
your gift. When you consider giving to the ACA or any
other charity don’t do it because you feel obligated, or
guilty. Give to make a connection with your community.
Give to bond with your fellow man. Give to encounter
“God’s Nature.” Give for the most selfish reason of all, to
experience the Joy of Giving.
