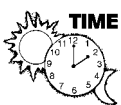

OFFICE HOURS

From the desk of Katie Hodock, Assistant to the Campus Minister

Pick up a Bible and read the last couple verses of the Gospel of Matthew. Here, Jesus gives us a job. He tells us that we need to “make disciples of all nations.” I often wondered how I could do this. When I asked someone I thought was wise how I should do my job, they responded, “They should know you’re a Christian by the way you climb a tree.” I never really understood what this meant until I began interacting with faithful students. In college, I received a degree in Catholic Studies. I never knew what function it would have when I started medical school, but I have had the opportunity to come to UNM and work with the students in a special formational aspect. I thought I would teach and challenge students, but I never thought about the fact that they would change me. I have met many students who show me exactly how they are Christians by the way they eat meals, dance, and sing. Their interactions with one another show me that they are Christians. They do this by developing a true relationship with Christ and hoping that everything they do will bring others closer to Christ. The way that they do this is through prayer. I have tried to tell the Peer Campus Ministers, and show them through example that if they are not praying they are not doing their jobs, because we cannot effectively reach other people without praying. The same is true for all Christians. If you preach to others via teaching classes and you are not praying, you are not doing your job. If you sing in the choir and you do not turn your songs into a prayer, you are not doing your job. If you attend Mass and consider yourself a faithful Christian and do not pray, you are not doing your job. The mission that we just finished was themed “Each One Reach One.” I reflected on how I could best reach one during the week, and I realized that it will not be by doing something huge, but rather by climbing a tree like a Christian. The little things that I do need to be done with love and turned into a prayer. Look around the parish and you will find people; students, families, new parishioners, and people who have been in the parish forever that do just this. They turn everything they do into a prayer. They go into the workplace and show they are Christians by the way they type a report or reconcile a ledger. They go home and show they are Christians by tucking their daughter into bed. If we as Christians are not continually challenged to turn everything we do into a prayer, we are not doing our job. Let us be challenged to pray, and make disciples of all those around us for Christ.
