From the desk of Catherine Loweree, Peer Campus Minister of Faith Formation

Growing up, my family has always enforced the importance of faith. I was baptized when I was two months old. I went to a Catholic school from kindergarten through eighth grade. All my friends were Catholic and so was most of my family. I lived in a comfortable world of memorized prayers and twice weekly masses. It was quite a shock when I arrived at a public high school and found myself in the minority for the first time. Hardly anyone was Catholic and no one talked about religion. When faith did come up in conversation, it usually came with questions. Many of my friends were Baptist, Christian or not practicing any religion, and they all wanted to know why I believed what I did. For the first time in my life I had to defend my faith, and to my surprise, I didn't know how. I had no answer when they asked me why we had to confess to a priest instead of just praying for forgiveness. They wanted to know why saints were so important to us and why only men could be priests. I'm embarrassed to say that my response was, "that's just the way that it is."

Apart from making me feel embarrassed, these interrogations allowed me to look at Catholicism from an outsider's point of view. I realized that many Catholic rituals seem weird or unnecessary to those who were not Catholic. I began asking myself, why do I believe all these things? Why do I feel this is important? My only reason was because that is what I was raised to believe. This annoyed me, so I set out to relearn my faith. Instead of just going through the motions at church, I studied each part and each prayer. I listened to viewpoints of other faiths and compared them to Catholicism. Through this searching I solidified what I had known in my heart all along. Catholicism made sense. The Church preached the highest truth, and had the best interests of mankind at heart. I discovered the beauty and value in every ritual and sacrament. The strength of my faith and my love for God grew greater than it ever had, and I knew that if asked about being Catholic, I could answer honestly and proudly.

Believing is only half the battle. You must understand why you believe. Part of being Catholic is being able to defend our beliefs with sound reasoning and honest answers, and when you have explored and discovered your faith you will build a closer and stronger relationship with God. So I encourage all of you to not be afraid to ask questions. Through learning more about Catholicism and understanding how it relates to your own life, you will grow deeper in your faith and even closer to Christ.
