From the desk of Rosie Chinaea, Director of Campus Ministry

Today is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. Catherine LaCugna in her book *God with Us* states that, “the doctrine of the Trinity is ultimately a practical doctrine with radical consequences for Christian life” (377). Ultimately the Trinity is a framework for contemplating and reflecting on the mystery of our relationship between humankind and all other creatures here on earth, and on the relationship between ourselves and God (380); relationship is the central theme of all Trinitarian theology. Living Trinitarian faith means living God’s life: living from and for God; from and for others; living as Jesus lived, preaching the Gospel, relying on God, offering healing, reconciliation, and praying constantly (401). We are called to be animated by the Spirit and to live a life towards the holiness which we are all called to become more like Christ.

“The love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us” (Romans 5:5). The beauty of Catholic theology is that it is based on the “goodness” of all creation. All of us are created to be “good”. This goodness is rooted in a deep love, *agape*, that God has for us. Regardless of what we have done in the past we were all created as “good” and our tendencies, if rooted in deep prayer, lean towards love because we were created in love and we are love. “The Spirit of truth will guide you to all truth” (Jn. 16:13). If we are living in right relationship with God and others, if we are praying unceasingly in all that we do (I Thes. 5), if we are truly striving to live as Christ created us to be, by listening to God on a deep level, God will guide us to truth in everything we do.

Trinitarian theology and today’s scripture passages truly speak to me today. As some of you might have already heard after serious discernment and prayer I have decided not to return as the Director of Campus Ministry with the Aquinas Newman Center for the 2010-2011 academic year. This prayerful decision was difficult. I truly enjoy working with the students. However deep in my heart and in my soul I know that God is asking me to trust Him to move on. These last four years at Newman have been a true blessing. I have truly enjoyed walking with the students on their journeys of faith; I see it as having been sacred time to minister with and for the students. Although I am excited about what the future holds, I will miss you all tremendously. I am certain that God will continue to watch over you and guide you all. I wish everyone at the Aquinas Newman Center continued blessings. Know that wherever I am you will all have a special place in my heart, and, I will pray for you always. I leave you with some questions for reflection upon your own living out of the theology of the Trinity: Reflect
