2010 Luke 12:13-21**

The rich man is a fool because he mistakenly thinks his future happiness is guaranteed by his possessions. Even had his life not been demanded of him, those possessions could not have bought him happiness. Jesus cautions us to “guard against” such greed and turn our attention to where our real inheritance lies: in the fullness of life God wishes to give us. How mistaken the rich man is to identify good living with material things and miss “[W]hat matters to God”!

- If I knew that “this night [my] life would be demanded of [me]”, what would I do?
- For me, what does being “rich in what matters to God” mean? How is this revealed?

From The Liturgy Committee: “Did you know?”

The term “Ordinary Time” may be misleading. In the context of the liturgical year the term “ordinary” does not mean “usual or average.” Ordinary here means “not seasonal.” Ordinary Time is that part of the Liturgical Year that lies outside the seasons of Lent-Easter and Advent-Christmas. In Ordinary Time, the Church celebrates the mystery of Christ not in one specific aspect but in all its aspects. The use of the term “Ordinary Time” was used before the Second Vatican Council, but it was not until after the council that the term was officially used to designate the period between Epiphany and Lent, and the period between Pentecost and Advent. After the new Catholic Calendar took effect in 1969, the older designations, “Season After Epiphany” and “Season After Pentecost,” were no longer used.

The liturgical color for Ordinary Time is green, a sign of hope.
